 - Need consistency in finding resources
 - Perspective in product diversity

- Evaluate/identify the benefits and challenges for the mitigation practice of label-mandated training.
- Discuss alternatives to label-mandated training.
- Develop a white paper that provides EPA and product registrants with more information about this practice, including the benefits and difficulties.
- Work to ensure label mandated registration requirements take into consideration the impacts to SLAs, PSEPs, and the applicator community.

CTAG Call for Collaborators - On-demand and Webinar Training

The Certification and Training Assessment Group (CTAG) (https://ctagroup.us/current-issues/) has identified On-demand and Webinar Training as one of the current issues to address. CTAG is a group of state lead agencies (SLA), pesticide safety education programs (PSEP), and tribal certification programs that can rely on each other for collaboration, eliminate duplication of effort and maximize the utility of existing solutions for pesticide applicator certification and training (C&T). The CTAG workgroup for Ondemand and Webinar Training has developed the initial scoping document to frame the discussion on this issue. The next step is to facilitate a broader discussion with PSEPs, SLAs and industry stakeholders. As part of the US EPA Meetings Implementation Cooperative Agreement with Michigan State University (MSU), national Collaboration Teams (CTs) are used to facilitate stakeholder discussions on issues related to Worker Protection Standard (WPS), pesticide applicator certification and related pesticide regulatory and educational programs designed to assist in reducing human health and environmental risks associated with pesticide use.

- Issues to consider:
 - Identify how states approve on-demand and webinar online trainings.
 - Develop considerations for reviewing and approving trainings.
 - Describe various on-demand learning management systems.
 - Identify online course requirements for states.
 - Describe how participation is monitored in online training.
 - Compare results of on-demand and webinars for commonality.

Webinar & On-Demand Collaboration Team



- Issues of discussion:
 - How many states allow on-demand online and webinar training for initial eligibility training and/or recertification?
 - Need to clearly define the difference between on-demand online training and webinars. Some states consider them to be the same; some states consider them to be different.
 - Applicator identification methods required by states and what could be acceptable.
 - For states not allowing on-demand or webinar online training, what do they see as barriers? How could these barriers be overcome?
 - Federal regulatory requirements for this type of training.

Manual Development for States CTAG



- Issues of discussion:
 - Prioritize manual development list
 - Discuss/create steps for manual development (national level, regional) level, etc.)
 - Who will create the manual material
 - How/where will the manual material be maintain/housed
 - Who has access to the manual material and/or rights to the material
 - Assign tasks to CTAG members
